Regenerative practices are a response to a *fast-paced world* and the social and ecological repercussions of this *speed* which are causing a disconnection from the past, nature and each other, while dissolving hope for the future.

By questioning how **we design, consume and co-exist**, the panellists present possible **ways of crafting an ecosystem of care rooted in what has always existed - the regional knowledge, culturally embedded symbolism, local resources, and intangible cultural heritage**. The accumulated wisdom of a particular place, of then and now, is a unity of thought and action, knowledge and craft that has been and is only possible with contribution from the many. It is not a *solo act*.

This conversation is woven with the belief in **the power of collaborative models to be catalysts for systems-change**. The projects represented in the panel share common values in their approach to design, consumption and co-existence, and operate with different mediums within the fields of textiles, product life-cycle, object design and research.
